



9.3.4.4. **CENTRE ACHIEVEMENT:**

2 Students in Hospitality received 7 distinctions in NCV programme during the 2011 External Examination with an average of 88, 43% and 84, 29% respectively.

9.3.4.5. **COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:**

- The Primary Agriculture Level 2 students embarked on outreaches to the neighbouring communities by donating cabbage, grown by themselves, to various community centres during the months of September and October.
- The students also visited Zamokuhle Centre for the Disabled and cleared the area in front of the church to establish a food garden for the Centre. The students also helped to transfer their vegetable growing skills to the disabled students in a sustainable manner.
- The Hospitality Level 2 - Level 4 students gave 67 minutes of their time on Mandela Day by visiting Herfsland Old Age Home and Foundation Phase Early Learning Centre where all residents and children received soup and sandwiches.
